Thanksgiving Potluck





Chinese New Year is always the most exciting festival for children because they can get a lot of red envelopes from their elders. Red envelopes are filled with money! Chinese people love the color red and see red as the symbol of energy, happiness, and good luck. Sending red envelopes is a way to send good wishes and luck to other people. In fact, the significance of red envelopes is the red paper, not the money. Wrapping money in the red envelopes is a symbol that sends more happiness and blessings to the recipient. In Chinese culture, red envelope is called Ya Sui Qian (壓歲錢), which means 'suppressing ghosts money'. Those who get a red envelope are wished another safe and peaceful year. mminm

The important part of Chinese New Year must be the food! During the Chinese New Year parties, there is more food that we can count. Traditionally, every food has a different meaning, which are very interesting. The most common Chinese New Year foods include dumplings, fish, spring rolls, and sticky rice cake (nian gao). Dumplings and spring rolls symbol wealth. Eating fish can increase prosperity and eating nian gao wishes that everybody can have a higher income or a higher position and that children will grow taller. You should try all of them!

From setting off firecrackers, sticking red paper signs, to New Year's reunion dinners, giving and receiving red envelopes, everything during Chinese New Year has their own symbolic meanings. These are all traditions passed down from our ancestors. Next time, if you have the opportunity, celebrate the New Year with a Chinese family. That will be an interesting experience for you!




Andrew: What advice would you give to people who are learning English for the first time?


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Studénť Artwork
