Tech Review: Vivo Dual Display

The phone is one of the most essential devices that everyone owns. It has altered the way that people work, socialize, and organize. The phone is just like a human's second brain which can do anything for us: communication, photos and video, learning and research, and watching live events. Today, Vivo has turned something impossible into reality which was launched in China one month ago. This newest product is called the Vivo Dual Display Edition.

The Vivo Nex Dual Display is one of the first handfuls of dual screen phones that had ever been made. This design allows your phone to

work on either the front or back side of the screen. It brings a full-fledged secondary screen at the back with a dedicated power button. On the one side, it has a 5.49 inches 1080x1920 display and a 1080x2340 display on the other side. The phone is made out of OLED and AMOLED panels. In this phone, there are two ways to unlock it. The front screen by using a fingerprint sensor which takes a fraction of a second. Or on the other side of the screen by using 3D Sensing camera. This system works extremely fast in both good light and inside a dark room.

With this phone, Vivo has designed a program called Secondary Selfie

Display. The program's main point is to take a selfie. Within this program, it has a mirror mode. Such a mode displays the camera output on both the front and back displays. This design is extremely useful when taking a photo of other people because it allows the photo takers to see their pose in a way that they like before taking the picture.

At this point, we could conclude that the Nex Dual Display holds a powerful software and an extra screen on a phone. We would hope to see Vivo bring better features and software for the next generation.

The first competition is known as the Scholar's Challenge. It is an individual task of multiple choice where you can fill in more than one answer. The fewer answer you mark, the more points you can earn if you're right. This challenge has about one hundred and twenty questions that are in the range of literature, art, science, history, music, and unsolve mistery. Apply all of your knowledge of those six subjects in the Scholar's challenge and you might win one, two, or

also be judges to grade the writing, and if you get a high score, then you will receive medals.

The third competition is Team
Debates. It is also a competition
with a group of three people. Each
team will debate three times with
different opponents. Your team will
either be affirmative or negative. If
your team is affirmative, then you'll
have to present all the points and
persuade the opponents and judge
about your motion. On the other
hand, the negative team will try

their best to attack and refute against what the affirmative team says. In the end, the judge will decide which team wins the case and the winner will move on to the higher level.

Last but not least, the Scholar's bowl! This is also a group competition where you get a clicker and seat in a theater with your teammate. Your team will work together to solve analytical questions and diverse challenges on the screen. After you come up with an answer with your teammates, you will press your answer on a clicker. Remember that it's not the first team who answers correctly that gets all the credit, instead, anyone that answers correctly will get all the credit. At last, the adjudicator will calculate all the scores you earn and see if you can get prizes or not.

Also, anyone who attends the competitions will get at least one medal. 

& Cheese with lots of chicken and broccoli. You can add anything you want though due to your personal eating preferences. The Mac & Cheese was delicious and students are looking forward to making and enjoying more great food in the future.



Ingredients (for 4 servings)

□ 2 tablespoons olive oil
□ 2 chicken breasts, cut into 1 inch (2cm) pieces
□ salt, to taste
□ pepper, to taste
□ ½ cup yellow onion, about half an onion, diced (75 g)
□ 2 cloves garlic, about 1 tablespoon, minced
□ 2 cups chicken broth (470 mL)
□ 3 cups water (710 mL)
□ 16 oz pasta shells (455 g)
□ 4 cups broccoli, or one head of broccoli (1 kg)
□ ½ teaspoon cayenne powder
□ ¼ teaspoon nutmeg
□ 1 cup milk (235 mL)
□ 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese (200 g)

Preparation

- 1. Heat olive oil on medium heat in a large pot. Add chicken breasts, season with salt and pepper, and allow the chicken to brown on one side
- 2. Flip chicken, then add onions and garlic as the second side browns.
- 3. Once the chicken has browned on both sides, add chicken broth, water, and pasta to the pot.
- 4. Stir all ingredients, cover the pot with a lid, and bring to a boil. When it begins to boil, uncover and stir. Bring the heat to low, stir, then cover and let simmer for 20 minutes.
- 5. After 20 minutes has passed, uncover and add in the broccoli. Stir continually as the broccoli steams until the rest of the liquid evaporates.
- 6. Add milk and cheddar cheese and stir until the cheese melts and you have a smooth cheese sauce.
 7. Add salt and pepper (to taste), cayenne, and nutmeg. Stir once more, then you're ready to serve.
